Issues ③ Responding to tightened environmental regulations

Efforts to reduce fine dust pollution

Government to step up countermeasure against fine dust pollution

- Special act launched for fighting fine dust pollution(a.k.a. Fine dust Act)
- Government monitors and regulates emission of air pollutants
- Regulatory Enforcement concentration limits on NOx, SOx, TSP etc.
